



Dr. Kourtney Santucci is an Associate Professor of Pediatrics at the University of Colorado School of Medicine and the Co-Medical Director of the Neurodegenerative Diseases MDC at Children's Hospital Colorado in Denver (since 2020). She is the Associate Medical Director of the Special Care Clinic at Children's Colorado, the country's largest outpatient program for medical home and complex

care coordination serving Children with Medical Complexity (CMC). She completed an undergraduate degree in biological anthropology ('00), medical school ('05), Residency in Pediatrics ('08), and served as the Chief Resident ('09) all at Emory University in Atlanta. She then worked as a Pediatric Hospital Medicine physician for 4 years at Erlanger Children's Hospital as an Assistant Professor of Pediatrics for the University of Tennessee College of Medicine. After developing a passion for caring for children who spend a lot of time at the hospital, Dr. Santucci transitioned to outpatient care of children with medical technology assistance needs and other chronic conditions, which led to Denver. After caring for children in the Special Care Clinic for six years, which involved much collaboration with many specialists, she was asked in 2020 to help lead the new Neurodegenerative Diseases MDC in Denver, founded with support from Batten disease family foundations. Dr. Santucci's research and clinical work focuses on defining and refining best practices for caring for children with rare neurological disorders.



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
