

Jennifer Vermilion, MD is a board-certified Child Neurologist and an Assistant Professor of Neurology and Pediatrics at the University of Rochester (NY) where she is the Director of the University of Rochester Batten Center (URBC). She is also the Director of the Pediatric Movement Disorders Fellowship. Dr. Vermilion received her BS (molecular and cellular biology) from Vanderbilt University and her MD from the University of Rochester. She started her clinical research career as a medical student,

focusing on CLN3 disease. She remained actively involved in Batten research until she took over as the Director of the URBC in 2023. After medical school, she completed residency training in Child Neurology at the University of Rochester, where she stayed on to complete a dual fellowship in Pediatric Movement Disorders and Experimental Therapeutics. She joined the faculty at the University of Rochester in 2019.

Dr. Vermilion has active research programs in the Neuronal Ceroid Lipofuscinoses (NCLs; Batten diseases) and tic disorders. In the NCLs, she leads the URBC natural history study, which has been working to characterize the different NCLs for over 20 years. She is also involved in sponsored studies related to NCL treatments.

Dr. Vermilion serves on the editorial board for the Pediatric Neurology journal. She previously served on the Scientific Program Committee at the CNS and as a member of the editorial board for the Resident and Fellow Section of the Neurology journal.
